



Create a quilt or wall hanging, in any size, using a favourite photo as the colour inspiration. The photo may be one you've taken, seen online or found in a magazine. Use it for choosing your fabric colours. You don't have to duplicate the photo or do a quilting interpretation, unless you wish.

Choose <u>three</u> to <u>seven</u> colours from the photo to create your project. If your photo has two or more shades of one colour, then each shade will count as a separate colour choice. Your challenge project can be created using a pattern of your choice or your own design, using <u>solid fabrics only!</u>



Prizes for 1st, 2nd and 3rd will be presented at the guild meeting in June. Remember: You will need to pin your photo to the front of your quilt so we may see your inspiration ... AND, of course, HAVE FUN!


Quilts of Valour


