

Block of the Month

Sheila Keating, Cheryl Griffin and Barbara Laycock

FEBRUARY - MODERN 3 COLOUR WOVEN block (8 1/2" finished)



This block is made twice with Fabric 1 sewn to the opposite side of Fabrics 2 and 3.

Cut

2 - Fabric 1 red - 4 1/2" x 8 1/2"

2 - Fabric 2 white - 4 1/2" x 5 1/2"

2 - Fabric 3 black - 3 1/2" x 4 1/2"

Block of the Month

Assembly

- Sew 1 white & 1 black fabric pieces together along the 4 ½" side times two. Press to the dark side.
- Sew 1 red to the white & black unit (with black at the top) on the right side.
- Repeat with the remaining red but sew on the left side of the white and black unit with the black at the top. Press to the red.
- When sewing the blocks together, all the blocks will have the black fabric at top.
- Row 1 all the blocks will have the red fabric on the right.
- Row 2 all the blocks will have the red fabric on the left.
- Keep alternating the rows until you have the correct length.
