President's Challenge 2017-2018

Create a quilt or wall hanging, in any size, using a favourite photo as the colour inspiration. The photo may be one you've taken, seen online or found in a magazine. Use it for choosing your fabric colours. It is not necessary to duplicate the photo or do a quilting interpretation.

Choose <u>three</u> to <u>seven</u> colours from the photo to create your project. If your photo has two or more shades of one colour, then each will count as a separate colour choice. Your challenge project can be created using a pattern of your choice or your own design - <u>solid fabrics only!</u>

You will need to pin your photo to the front of your quilt so we may see your inspiration ... AND, of course, HAVE FUN!

McMaster Neonatal Outreach

What a great response from guild members for Inspirational Hearts, 💎 the guild's new project for McMaster Children's Hospital Neonatal Nursery! These flannel hearts will be given to the mothers and fathers with newborns in the NICU.

The parents wear the flannel heart \checkmark against their skin so the fabric absorbs their scent. The hearts are then placed in the incubator or crib so that the scent is always with their baby. Research shows that this helps to comfort the baby. Upon their release from the hospital, the babies and their families will be taking these hearts home with them!

At February's meeting, many kits were taken home to be sewn, and it is hoped that some will be returned at the meeting in March. It would be fantastic to take in a hundred of the hearts to the NICU this month! Thanks to everyone for your help and love in making these very special hearts.

Quilters Helping Quilters

I recently noticed that my self-healing cutting mat is looking a little worse for wear - actually, one mat was looking a LOT worse for wear. I went on the Internet and found these steps to follow to avoid having to buy a replacement ... an expensive purchase as we all know ... money better spent on FABRIC!

How to Care For Your Self-Healing Cutting Mat

WASH Fill your bathtub with enough ROOM TEMPERATURE water to cover the mat.

ADD Pour in 1/4 cup of white vinegar and a quick squirt of dish soap (for lather).

SCRUB Use a soft bristle brush to GENTLY scrub your cutting mat. Work up a good lather.

RINSE Use COLD water to rinse your mat, making sure to get all the soapy residue off before drying.

DRY You may choose to towel dry or air dry your mat. Either way, AVOID direct sunlight and lay the mat flat when drying and storing so the mat does not become warp.

How to Maintain Your Rotary Cutter



Keeping blades sharp is the best way to guarantee clean cuts every time. When sharp,

blades need less pressure to cut, they give a more accurate cut with less chance of slipping. Blades blunt with use and this will damage your self-healing mat. *I should have realized that*. A sharp blade has minimum penetration, so the mat works more effectively with less fabric lint entering the cut.

Did you know that blades may be flipped over for longer use? I didn't. It looks like I have some jobs to add to my "to do" list. As it is, there appears to be a difference of opinion as to whether sharpening blades with special tools as opposed to replacing them is the way to go. I wonder what most members of our guild think? (Credit: various articles found on the Internet and Pinterest)

Ode to the Rotary Cutter

Your rotary cutter cuts like butter, But ask me how I know. It was a Friday eve, some stress to relieve, So quilting here I go.

My ruler was straight, the material flat, I was ready to cut my first quarter fat. All of a sudden, that extremely sharp widget, Had cut the nail off and part of my digit!

So I washed out the wound and took to my bed, But in the morning my pillow was alarmingly red. I guess this won't get better without some attention, So off to the ER was the best intervention. The doctor had no empathy for my stupidity, But bandaged me up anyway. He sent me home with this instruction: No quilting for the rest of the day.

Take Tylenol for pain and don't get the wound wet, It will take 3 weeks for your skin to reset. I could get through some inconvenience and stares, But how in the world could I wash my long hair?

So spend Friday nights with at least 40 winks, Quilt on Saturday when you're rested and can think. Your cutter is your friend and will make quilting fun, But don't get complacent and give it free run!






