The photo may be one you've taken, found in a magazine, or that you saw online. The photo is only for choosing your fabric colours. You don't have to do a quilting interpretation of it or try to duplicate the photo, unless you want to do so.

Choose three to seven colours from the photo to create your project. If your photo has two or more shades of one colour, then each shade will count as a separate colour choice. Your challenge project can be created using a pattern of your choice or your own design, using solid fabrics only!



Prizes for 1^{st} , 2^{nd} and 3^{rd} will be presented at the guild meeting in June. Remember: You will need to pin your photo to the front of your quilt so we may see your inspiration ... AND, of course, HAVE FUN!

CHALLENGE BLOCKS COST PER KIT: \$5.00



General Workshop Information:



- Workshops are held at **ST. STEPHEN UNITED CHURCH**, 2258 Parkway Drive, Burlington.
- Remember to bring your lunch to the workshop. Coffee and tea will be provided.

Join us on **Saturday, November 25th** to learn the HUNTER STAR block! Only two fabrics are required. Our very own **Tasha Yhard** will teach us a simple method for what can be a difficult block to make. At October's meeting, a sample will be available for viewing at the Workshop table. A supply list will be given when the workshop fee is made.

As noted last month, our workshop fee has been increased to **\$40.00** for members and \$55.00 for guests, as approved by the executive. This is still a bargain for a great day of quilting spent with good company!



Quilters Helping Quilters - Keep your sewing scissors in tip-top shape!

- 1. AVOID MOISTURE Avoid setting your scissors on your ironing board, as your board will retain the moisture from the steam a lot longer than you may think.
- **2. CUT FABRIC ONLY!** It's tempting ... but keep your good fabric scissors for just that ... fabric and thread!
- 3. HAVE A SPARE PAIR. Keep an extra pair of scissors on hand for cutting other things that might damage your fabric scissors.
- **4. KEEP IT SHARP!** Have your scissors sharpened regularly by a professional knife sharpener. Sometimes this can be done through your local fabric store.
- 5. WIPE THEM CLEAN. Wipe your scissors often with a dry soft cloth, such as muslin, to keep the blades free of lint and other fabric fuzz.
- 6. ALWAYS AVOID PINS This goes without saying, of course!
- 7. DON'T DROP THEM! This one goes without saying, too!
- 8. KEEP THE CASE CLOSED. Good scissors often have a case or sleeve to keep them safe and protected when not in use, so use it to keep the blades clean and free from dust.
- **9. MAKE A WORTHY INVESTMENT.** A quality pair may be costly but will cut better, last longer, and can be easily sharpened.
- 10. CUT AT THE RIGHT SPOT. When cutting thin fabrics and small areas like notches, using the tips of the scissors is great. However, when cutting thick and heavy fabrics, rely on the part of the scissors where the two blades separate near the joint with the screw.


November 2, 2017 Tracey Lawko, an award winning textile artist who creates landscapes and still life in thread will be our guest.
