

### Special Quilts Display

On display were our **Trillium Quilt** (honourable mention at the 1978 CNE Centennial), three **Friendship Quilts** (a cross-Canada quilt project) and the **Bicentennial Quilt** on loan from the Burlington Public Library. We also had, as a special guest, **Tracy Breckon**, who represented the 150 Burlington farm families whose roots date back from the 1800s. Tracey brought several old quilts, including one from 1905 which was beautifully hand embroidered.

Our mini event generated visitor interest in joining our guild and in our upcoming Quilt Show. Guests enjoyed the opportunity to ask questions and shared some of their own stories with us. Many were very curious about how quilting is done and enjoyed the opportunity to see how it has changed.

### **Block of the Month**

#### Sheila Keating, Cheryl Griffin and Barbara Laycock

**SEPTEMBER - The Very Quick & Easy Scrap Buster Block** (8" block in Autumn Colours)

Cut: one 6" x 8" rectangle in autumn colours or print one 2 ½" x 8" strip in dark greens

**Sew** the 8" green strip to the 8" side of rectangle. If using directional fabric, sew the strip to the bottom of the rectangle. Press to the green strip.

### Assembly:

Row 1 Attach the green side on bottom; green strip on left side; repeat across the row.

Row 2 Attach the green strip on left side; green strip on bottom; repeat across the row and continue, reversing the rows until the desired size is complete.

Add a 1 ½" border and a 3" border or whatever width is desired.



**OCTOBER - The Floating Square in a Block** (12 1/2" block in any 3 colours)

Cut: Colour A (solid or tone on tone) - two 3" x 5" and one 5" x 13"

Colour B (solid or tone on tone) - two 3" x 5" and one 5" x 13"

Focal Fabric - one 5" square

**Sew** one Colour A and one Colour B along the 5" sides, twice.

Press the seams open. Square up to 5".

**Sew** these A & B squares to opposite sides of the <u>Focal Fabric</u> square, making sure the colours are vertical and matching on the same side. Press the seams to the Focal Fabric. **Sew** the centre long rectangles on each side of centre rectangle, matching the colours. Press the seams open. Square up to 12 1/2".
